Did you know?

Recycling just one banana skin generates enough energy to charge your smartphone twice.

How is your food waste recycled?

It's all quite clever. The food waste you put out for recycling is taken to a special processing plant, where it is turned into an organic fertiliser that farmers can use to help grow their crops. The gases produced in this process are captured and used to drive a turbine which generates electricity.
